



### **Don't be Part of the Equation**

Electrical safety is part of our everyday routine, but it's not just important for workers in our industry. Everyone should know how to stay safe around electricity.

May is Electrical Safety Month, and it's a good time to remind members and the public how to respond if you are involved in, or come across, a utility pole accident.

We have seen a steady increase in these types of accidents in the last few years. As expected, the average cost per accident has increased as well, averaging over \$6,000 per incident.

Distracted driving, inclement weather, speeding and driving while impaired all play a part. Once you hit a pole, you're not only going to have car trouble, but you are also going to be responsible for any damage to the utility equipment.

Plus, there's the danger of potential electrical injury.

Knowing some basic safety precautions before an accident occurs can help. If you are involved in a utility pole accident, your first instinct may be to immediately exit the vehicle, but often the safest thing to do is to stay put. Due to damage, a pole may fall over, or overhead lines may fall onto the vehicle.

You should always assume these lines are energized, even if they aren't sparking or buzzing. That's why we suggest staying in your vehicle. Warn others to stay away, call 911 and wait until a professional from the utility company tells you it is safe to exit.

If the situation inside the vehicle becomes unsafe — maybe from smoke or fire — and you must exit, do so with safety in mind. Push the door open with both hands, then cross your arms over your chest and jump clear without touching any parts of the vehicle. Try to land with your feet together so they hit the ground at the same time. Then hop (like a bunny) away to safety, keeping both feet together. This is to avoid any difference in voltage between your two feet. If there is any electrical charge on the ground or the car, you don't want to become part of the equation. Separating your feet or touching the car and ground at the same time can result in an electrical shock.

If you witness a vehicle hitting a utility pole, do not approach the scene. Stay at least 35 feet away — about the length of a school bus — and call 911. Never touch or try to remove a downed line. You may put your own life at risk by trying to help.

Adams Electric Cooperative offers high- and low-voltage safety demonstrations for groups, which cover such things as vehicle accidents. Through our live demonstrations, attendees learn about common electrical hazards and also witness simulations of what happens when a live wire gets loose.

If you don't want to spend \$6,000 this year, put your phone away, take your foot off the accelerator and (when you get home) consider learning more about electrical safety at adamsec.coop.







# Keeping it Local for nearly 100 Years! ShipNC.com

Extra, Extra, Read All About it! Those six words were heard in every community around the country dating back to the early 1800s. When the local paperboy uttered those words, the town knew the newspaper's latest edition had just rolled off the presses. Shippensburg has a long-standing tradition of printing the news and publishing a newspaper. In 2027, the Shippensburg News-Chronicle will celebrate its 100th Anniversary!

The first bit of news or mention of a newspaper in Shippensburg dates back to 1844, according to the history publication "Shippensburg's 250 Year History." John L. Baker is credited with publishing the "Weekly News" in April 1844, a strong Whig paper.

Jacob Bomberger purchased the Weekly News in 1849. Later owners included John McCurdy, (Shippensburg's first historian), D.R. Wagner, Edward W. Curriden, Daniel W. Thrush, D.K. and J.C. Wagner, J.C. Fleming and Charles E. and I.A. Hoke. The "Weekly News" changed hands frequently in the 1850's. When Edward Curriden purchased the paper, he changed the name to "The Shippensburg News" and published it at 60 West King Street.

The Hocks brothers purchased the paper on June 1, 1915, and continued publishing it until August 1927. The paper retained the "Shippensburg News" name until Ralph T. Wolfrom purchased the paper. Wolfrom also purchased another weekly paper, the "Shippensburg Chronicle." This publication was created in 1875 as the "Democratic Chronicle" and in 1882 became the "Shippensburg Chronicle", and was published in a brick building south of the Sherman Hotel on South Earl Street. In October 1927, Wolfrom merged both papers into one publication named "The News-Chronicle" and published them twice a week on Monday and Thursday.

In November 1932, "The News-Chronicle" moved to the former Frank E. Hollar, Sr. garage at 6-10 North Penn Street. In addition to newspapers, the presses were busy printing other materials, including matchbooks and stationery, wedding invitations, announcements, advertising publications, booklets and more. In fact, the News-Chronicle was a full-service printer responsible for a major portion of printed materials in Shippensburg and surrounding communities.

The News-Chronicle moved its printing operations in 1960 to a larger location along Route 11 at the east end of Shippensburg. For over forty years, while occupying the space known as the News-Chronicle Building, the newspaper prospered. In its heyday, the newspaper had close to 50 employees. From press operators, newsroom reporters, sales teams, office staff and everything in between, everyone worked together to make sure the newspaper arrived on newsstands and in mailboxes on time.

Fast forward to 2025, 181 years after the first news of any kind rolled off the presses, the News-Chronicle continues to be the ONLY hometown newspaper. That's quite a success story of progress and industry in Shippensburg.

The newspaper industry has changed and evolved tremendously over the course of nearly two centuries; however, the commitment to report and publish the latest news and information has not. The News-Chronicle, Newville Valley Times-Star, and the Chambersburg Chronicle are all published by a much smaller staff.

We often hear the phrases "SHOP SMALL and SHOP LOCAL" during the holidays. Those words are near and dear to our hearts year-round. By subscribing to the Shippensburg News-Chronicle, you'll always know what's happening in Shippensburg and the surrounding communities. We value our customers.
